All electrical appliances must be clearly declared. • CERTIFICATE OF RESIDENCE issued by the closest Uruguayan Consulate, clearly 	<p>Duty free entry whether goods are used or new.</p> <p>Uruguayan citizens returning home must submit before customs' authorities proof of permanent residence abroad for a minimum period of one year.</p>	<p>Shippers will be allowed to import either surface or airfreight shipments of HHGDS and PE, implied for domestic use only Shipments must arrive in URUGUAY within 180 days from Shipper's arrival in the country.</p> <p>Foreigners must have permanent residence in Uruguay in order to qualify for clearance. If their residence is being carried out, but not ready at time of applying for clearance, they must submit a guarantee before customs.</p>

New furniture and household goods		Duty free entry if imported as part of a household goods removal.	Customs authorities will hold these items until payment of duties is done.
Works of art, antiques		Duty free entry if these articles are part of a bona fide household removal. In case quantities are considered exaggerated by customs officer to the status or family group of applicant, these items may be subject to payment of duties.	
Precious metal objects (jewellery, coins)		Can be imported if part of household removal and quantities are reasonable.	
Household appliances		Duty free entry if these articles are part of household removal.	
Electrical appliances		Same as for Household appliances. Only 1 article per kind can be brought in household removal except TV sets, videos and PC, which can exceed such quantity according to the number of family members.	
Carpets		Can be imported if part of household removals.	
Presents, souvenirs		Can be imported if part of household removal and quantities are reasonable.	
Motor vehicles	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Commercial invoice. Franchise from Ministry for Foreign Affairs (for foreign diplomats). Franchise from Ministry of Finance (for Uruguayan diplomats). <p>IMPORTANT: These documents must be legalized by Uruguayan Consulate at origin. An official translation of document into Spanish will also be required (which must be obtained in Uruguay).</p>	<p><u>FOREIGN DIPLOMATS</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Foreign diplomats accredited before Uruguayan Government will be allowed to import cars in accordance with their rank and value of the car. We suggest that they contact their /Embassy/Mission in this regard. Once Uruguay Ministry of Foreign Affairs authorizes import of the vehicle, the Embassy/Mission will request a franchise enclosing copy of purchase invoice and B/L 	Import of used vehicles is forbidden in Uruguay (through Law 17.787 dated 19 August 2005) except for Foreign diplomats and returning Uruguayan diplomats or Uruguayan citizens working for international organisations (<u>U.N., IADB, IMF, etc</u>)

The import of these cars will be subject to payment of port charges on CIF value, Customs ad-valorem on CIF value, COFIS, TSI, car's import certificates <p><u>ANY OTHER VEHICLES AND/OR ARTICLES</u></p> <p>Some other articles like boats, motors for boats, jet-skies, etc, may be imported subject to payment of import duties.</p> <p>We suggest that you contact your agent in Uruguay for any specific cases.</p> <p>Temporary import of cars is prohibited.</p>

Other vehicles (bicycles, water vehicle)		Bicycles can be imported duty free if part of household goods removal. Quantity cannot exceed the number of family members. All other vehicles are subject to payment of duties, if allowed to be imported.	
Wine, Alcohol		Subject to payment of duties.	
Machines, appliances, spare parts			Only Uruguayan professionals are allowed to bring in machines together with their removal goods, provided they have been abroad for at least 1 years and they can prove their professional condition. Machines <i>must</i> be for the specific use of the owner's profession and must be proved through the Consular certificate of residence
Tins and food			Can be imported if part of household removal and quantities are reasonable, but suggest to check on quantity and type of food.
Prohibited Items	Only sport guns are allowed to be imported requiring a certificate from Ministry of Defence.		Firearms (unless considered sport guns), ammunitions, narcotics and drugs, liquors, food, plants, <u>used vehicles</u> of all types including motorcycles, any other items that should not be considered part of a household goods removals. Suggest you contact us if in any doubt with regards to specific articles.
Medicines, narcotics & drugs		Prohibited.	
Plants		Cannot be included in household goods removals.	It is suggested not to bring in plants.
